

Pakistan hasn't seen floods of this ferocity for nearly a century. The impact has been devastating with **more than 20 million people** affected by these floods so far. Millions of refugees who have left their flooded, and severely damaged homes, now live in tents, schools and with their relatives. Some major cities, dams and bridges have also been wrecked. A total of **71** districts have been affected by floods through out the country. The number of severely hit districts is **30** while 41 districts are less affected, with **1,497 deaths, 2,054 injured and 980, 484 households affected**. National Commission for Human Development's (NCHD) Relief Work:

NCHD is present in all 144 districts of Pakistan, and has provided rescue teams, mobile and static emergency health camps, essential medicines and food items, clean drinking water and tents for shelter to the flood affectees. NCHD, in coordination with Provincial as well as District Administration is participating in rescue and relief operations ever since 30th of July 2010, initiating from Charsadda and Nowshera, and is now working in all 71 affected districts of Pakistan.

1. NCHD has so far rescued more than **5,000** marooned people using **33** boats in Charsadda, Nowshera, Khairpur, Muzaffargarh, Rahim Yar Khan and Layyah.
2. NCHD is further arranging **21** rescue boats from UK, in collaboration with Aman Foundation, for rescue operations in Punjab, Sindh and Balochistan.
3. NCHD has provided clean drinking water and water for general use in **16,841** bottles and **04** tankers in Charsadda, Nowshera, Muzaffargarh, Pabbi, Rajanpur, Bhakkar, Sargodha, Lodhran, Sukkur, Mianwali, Malakand, Swat, Mardan, Lower Dir, Abbottabad, D.G. Khan and Multan. Humanity First has provided **107** Aqua boxes through NCHD in Muzaffargarh and Nowshera.
4. NCHD has provided dry rations to **43, 268** people in Multan, Mianwali, Dera Ghazi Khan, Sukkur, Rajanpur, Khairpur, Nowshera, Charsadda, Muzaffargarh, Layyah, Sargodha, Rahim Yar Khan, Jacobabad, Lodhran and Bhakkar.
5. NCHD has adopted **14** camps of **100 families each** in Multan, Rajanpur, Khairpur, Shikarpur, Dadu, Kashmore, Charsadda, Sukkur, Mianwali, Muzaffargarh and D.G. Khan, in which almost **9, 500** people are being served cooked food on daily basis.
6. NCHD has provided **340** tents in Punjab, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Sindh to provide shelter to displaced families, and
7. NCHD has set up **390** mobile as well as static medical camps, treating **102, 222** patients. The number of camps is increasing on daily basis.
8. NCHD has also initiated Educational and Recreational activities for children in its established camps

NCHD is carrying out relief operations from donations alone, and no government funds are being used for this purpose.
